Xey Principle | No one is too broken to be used by God.

How does it help to see the mess David made of his life and know that he was forgiven by God and used by God despite all of his sins?

What made David a man after God's own heart? | Reread 1 Samuel 16:1-13

What do you notice about David from this first interaction? What do you think it means to be "after God's own heart?"

What would disqualify David? | Reread 2 Samuel 11:1-27; Psalm 51:1-9

David's actions should have disqualified him from being used by God, but it didn't. What do you learn about God's character?

What is the most important thing David needed? | Reread John 3:17

What does grace mean to you? How would you define or describe it to someone who asked?

What would make you a man or woman after God's own heart? |

Reread Hebrews 12:2; Psalm 51:10-17

What stands out from Psalm 51 that shows us what it looks like to be a man or woman after God's own heart?

Next Steps and Prayer |

- What are some ways that God can use any brokenness in your past to be a help to someone today?
- Close by praying for each other to allow God to use even the most broken parts of your stories for His bigger purpose.
